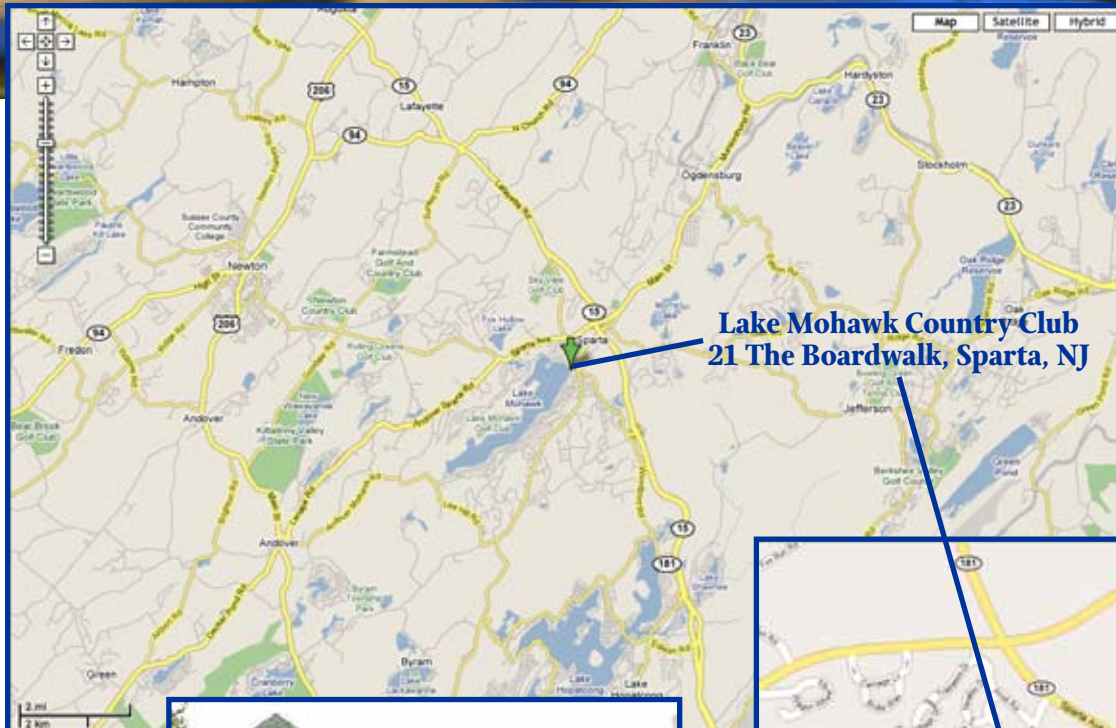
Frank X. Browne, of F.X. Browne, Inc., Lake Management Specialists

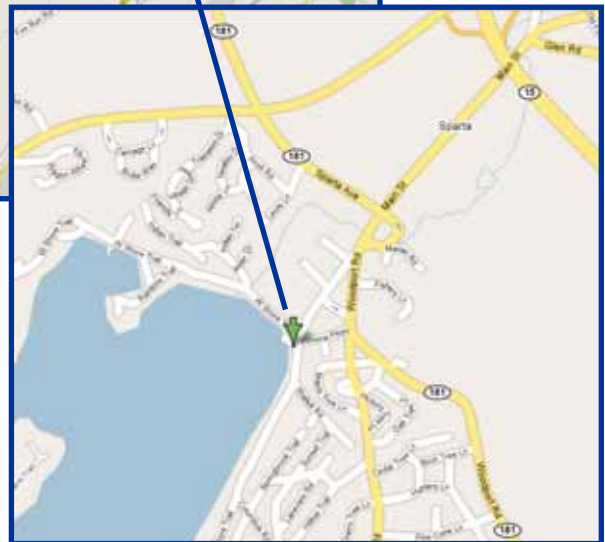

**Lake Mohawk Country Club
21 The Boardwalk, Sparta, NJ**



DIRECTIONS:

From the East: Route 80 West to Exit 34B (Sparta/Jefferson) to Route 15 North. Travel approximately 8.5 miles on Route 15, take the Sparta/Lake Mohawk Business District Exit. Continue straight onto Route 181 North; travel approximately 2.5 miles to Winona Parkway (Lake Mohawk Country Club sign on left at corner). Make a left turn down the hill to stop sign, continue straight across intersection onto West Shore Trail and down a small hill. The Lake Mohawk Country Club (building reminiscent of a castle, see photo above) is on the left. Parking is on the right.

From the West/South: Route 80 East to Exit #25 (Route 206 North) and proceed north, through Byram and past Cranberry Lake for approximately 6 miles. You will go through a tunnel and enter the town of Andover. At the light (Lenape Road) turn right and go 300 yards to a three way stop. Go straight following signs for County Road 613 and proceed 7 miles. When entering Sparta you will see Lake Mohawk on left. Continue to end and you will enter Lake Mohawk Plaza. Turn left at intersection of West Shore Trail, down a small hill. The Lake Mohawk Country Club (building reminiscent of a castle, see photo above) is on the left. Parking is on the right.

From the North (Route 23): In Franklin follow signs for Ogdensburg/Sparta and County Road 517 South. Approaching Sparta continue to follow signs for 517 South. Proceed under railroad trestle and over Route 15. At the 3rd light after trestle, turn left on Sparta Avenue and Route 181. Proceed to the first light, the Sparta Post Office will be on the left. Turn right on 181 South, proceed 200 feet, veer right and follow signs for Lake Mohawk and County Road 613. You will now be approaching Lake Mohawk Plaza. Turn right at intersection of West Shore Trail, down a small hill. The Lake Mohawk Country Club (building reminiscent of a castle, see photo above) is on the left. Parking is on the right.

From the North (Routes 206/94/15): From Lafayette take Route 15 south. In Sparta, where Route 15 widens to two lanes, veer right onto Route 18, Follow Route 181 approximately three miles proceed to the second light. The Sparta Post Office will be on the left. Turn right on Route 181 South, proceed 200 feet, veer right and follow signs for Lake Mohawk and County Road 613. You will now be approaching Lake Mohawk Plaza. Turn right at intersection of West Shore Trail, down a small hill. The Lake Mohawk Country Club (building reminiscent of a castle, see photo above) is on the left. Parking is on the right.

Please enter the Lake Mohawk Country Club through the main doors under the canopy at the lower level driveway, and follow the signs posted for the meeting in the "Papoose Room" of the Country Club.
